TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM COUNTY ROAD FUND TO B ROAD FUND

COUNTY TO TURN SPRAYING OF WEED ALONG HIGHWAYS BACK TO STATE

The Clerk was directed to write to James West, District Engineer, of Price, Utah, that the County would like the State to take care of spraying of weeds along the State Highways within the County.

COUNTY TO ACCEPT OPTION 2 WITH STATE BOARD OF HEALTH IN REGARDS TO THE NURSING PROGRAM WITHIN THE COUNTY

The Board of County Commissioners in connection with the School Board having decided to accept Option No. 2 of the State Board of Health Nursing Program, in which the School Board will pay 30% of the costs of a nurse, the County 30%, and the State 40%. It was further agreed that the County desires the services of a second nurse within the County and if necessary the School and County to share the costs on an equal basis. The Clerk was directed to write to the State Board of Health stating the Commissioners' desires.

ALL ROADMEN TO BUY TIRES THROUGH BAILEY'S INC.

The Clerk was directed to write to the road foremen that all tires must be ordered through purchasing department from Bailey's Inc.

RENTING OF NURSE'S OFFICE IN BLANDING TO CEASE

The Clerk was directed to write to the Blanding City Clerk that the County will have no more need for a Nurse's Office in Blanding.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING HELD AT MONTICELLO, UTAH ON MONDAY JUNE 15, 1959 10 A.M.

Meeting opened with all Commissioners and Deputy Clerk present.

REPRESENTATIVE OF RECREATION COMMITTEE MEETS WITH COMMISSIONERS

Bill Halls on behalf of the Recreation Committee met with commissioners regarding ownership of Monticello Swimming Pool, and quoting Mr. Halls, the committee doesn't want to take any action on activities until an ownership decision is reached. Commissioner Walton was of the opinion that somewhere in the City of Monticello minutes there might be an entry whereby they might assume the operation responsibility of the pool, but Mr. Chandler, city manager, reports that he found no minute entry to that effect, in the minutes dating from August 1955 forward. Commissioner is to meet with the City Council at their next meeting and discuss the problem at hand and find out if the city would consider taking over ownership of the pool through proper proceedings.

SALES TAX ORDINANCE TO BE PASSED

San Juan County Commissioners agreed to pass the local option sales tax ordinance. County attorney to prepare ordinance for county. Motion was made by Commissioner Bartell that county accept sales tax as presented and as quickly as can be arranged, the contract to be completed and sent in, motion seconded by commissioner Hazleton.

CIVIL DEFENSE MEETING AT PRICE, UTAH

Commissioner Hazleton will attend the Civil Defense meeting to be held in Price, Utah, on June 18, 7:00 P.M. Mr. Higgins, State Director of Civil Defense and Major Cleveland will be in attendance at meetings. Such subjects as Surplus Property, Contributions Program, County Plans, Continuity of Government in Emergency should be discussed, and the State Plan designates responsibility into the channels of local government. Homer Chandler, City Manager of Monticello, Utah reported to the commissioners that he thought a representative from their group would attend the meeting. A copy of the letter received from the Chairman of the Civil Defense Committee by the County Commissioners was forwarded to Francis D. Nielson, City Clerk of Blanding, inviting their co-operation in attending the meeting.
