Beef Basin Trails (from Monticello)

Go north on State Highway 191 out of Monticello. After about 14 miles you will come to mile marker 86 and the junction of Highway 191 and State Highway 211. Go west on 211 for about 19 miles. Here you come to the junction of Highway 211 and County road 107. Go southwest on 107. Pass over Salt Creek Mesa and continue onto the National Forest. When you come to the junction of County road 107 and County road 104 you will see a sign reading Beef Basin. This is the beginning of the Beef Basin trail system. Go north on this road. Refer to the map for trail details.

White Rim Trail (from Monticello)

Follow the description provided for the Beef Basin trail system, but when you get to the junction of County road 107 and County road 104 continue straight ahead for approximately 3 miles to the junction of County road 107 and County road 221. This is the beginning of the White Rim Trail. Go west and refer to the map for further trail details.
