Commissioner Adams made a motion to convene the San Juan County Board of Canvassers. Commissioner Maryboy 2nd the motion. Voting in favor was unanimous.

John David Nielson - SJC Clerk

John David presented the 2020 Presidential Primary Election results for the commission to canvass. He explained that the report showed all votes for each Presidential Candidate from the Democratic and Republican parties. John David stated that two candidates, Michael Bennet from the Democratic Party and Roque "Rocky" De La Fuente from the Republican Party had officially withdrawn from the race and any votes for them were not counted. John David also said that the winners of the election in San Juan County were Bernie Sanders from the Democratic Party and Donald Trump from the Republican Party.

He also explained that there were ballots that were rejected due to no signature, mismatch signature, being returned late, and other reasons such as voters voting at a polling location on election day.

Commissioner Grayeyes questioned which precincts were Navajo. John David explained that precincts that were predominately Navajo were precincts 3, 8, 10, and 11. He also explained that precinct 3 was located in the Montezuma Creek/Aneth area, precinct 8 was located mostly on the east side of hwy 191 south of Bluff and the west side of the Red Mesa road. John David also explained that precinct 10 was largely located in Bluff and on the west side of hwy 191 south of Bluff and that Mexican Hat, Monument Valley, Oljato, and Navajo Mountain were in precinct 11.

Commissioner Adams made a motion to accept the election canvass as presented. Commissioner Grayeyes 2nd the motion. Voting in favor was unanimous.

Commissioner Adams made a motion to reconvene the San Juan County Commission. Commissioner Grayeyes 2nd the motion. Voting in favor was unanimous.
