Lavender and Davis Canyon Rims

Not all routes shown on the ATV Trail System maps are recognized by other government agencies as travel routes. Please observe signs posted on travel routes or refer to agency maps.

Lavender-Davis Canyon Rim Trail

Go north out of Monticello on Highway 191 for approximately 12 miles. Near mile marker 86 find junction 191 and 211 going to the west. Highway 211 is a paved road going to Canyonlands National Park. Follow 211 for approximately 27 miles. Just after you cross over Indian Creek you will come to the junction of Highway 211 and the Davis Canyon road. From this point refer to the trail map for access specifics.

Bridger Jack, Heifer Mesa and Stevens Canyon Trails

Go north out of Monticello on Highway 191 for approximately 12 miles. Near mile marker 86 find the junction of 191 and 211 to the west. Highway 211 is a paved road to Canyonlands National Park. Follow Highway 211 for approximately 19 miles to the junction with County road 107 to the west. At the junction you will see a kiosk and toilet. This spot may serve as a staging area for Bridger Jack Mesa, Heifer Mesa and Stevens Canyon trails. Refer to the map for trail specifics.
